Together, the New Allied Powers are quietly devising a plan to take back their nations, while simultaneously secretly moving their oppressed citizens to Mars, which America still owns. Fortunately, the Second Soviet Union has yet to discover or develop the technology necessary to make the journey to claim Mars as their own.

In the past, each milestone to the Allies' take-back plan was somehow discovered and thwarted, and they realized they need to put their planning on hold to rethink their methods.
